ABSTRACT	A good practice of migrants' integration drawn from 20 countries beyond Europe for economic, religious, political, wars and famine reasons and welcomed in a small village in southern Italy. The medieval village of Riace was almost a ghost town 15 years ago. Houses were derelict, and the local school was near to closing. The Municipality, funded by Italian government, welcomed more than 450 asylum seekers in a resilient and sustainable way. Thanks to the mayor, the integration plan provided the abandoned apartments, training, working and education to refugees. It has helped to rebuild both the town's population and economy within a multiculturalism approach.
