ABSTRACT	The inclusion of migrants in emergency preparedness and response is becoming a priority for emergency management actors all around the world, in particular in increasingly diverse neighbourhoods, cities and countries. In many context, emergency management actors are supporting the active engagement of migrants in preparedness, response and recovery. This helps in reducing migrants' vulnerability in emergencies through improved circulation of relevant information and increased grass root response capacity. It also benfits communities as a whole, by allowing emergency management efforts to leverage all locally available capacities and resources. This document provides guidance to emergency management actors on how to promote the participation of migrants in emergency awareness, preparedness and response activities through "engagement programmes". In many contexts, designing and carrying out programmes to engage people in emergency management is a core function of mergency management actors' mandate and responsibility. Based on practices and lessons learned gathered from around the world, this tool offers some key recommendations on how to adapt design and implementation of relevant activities to effectively target migrant groups. This tool applies to a variety of "engagement programmes", encompassing diverse activities that may improve migrants' risk awareness, 2 capacity to respond or willingness to work or volunteer with emergency management actors.
